

Our section of

Jefferson County was named Indian Hills by early settlers of Louisville. Native Americans, primarily Cherokee and Shawnee, used the area for hunting purposes. Sometime before 1785, John Veech, born in Ulster, Ireland, arrived by flat boat in Louisville with his wife Agnes. Mr. Veech, a surveyor, bought Indian Hill Farm, which included Rolling Fields. John's grandson, Richard Veech, made a national reputation as a breeder for trotting horses which continued until the advent of the automobile. From 1878-1885, businessmen throughout the East often visited the Indian Hill Farm to purchase carriage horses. The horses were housed in a large barn situated near Rolling Lane between Pennington and Fairway Lane. The farm was sold to Louisville Country Club Reality Company in 1924, which later divided the property for the golf course expansion and sold approximately 300 acres to J. Graham Brown's Lumber company in 1949. He helped finance Rolling Fields with Wakefield-McMakin Reality Company. Plans for Rolling Fields were approved on June 1, 1950, which marks our founding day.

This is a brief history of our city. As we collect more information, we will be publishing an extended history of Rolling Fields, a place rich in history that we're proud to call home.

# Cop's Column

# LICENSE PLATE READER (LPR) CAMERAS

The Indian Hills Police Department began utilizing LPR cameras in 2022, with twelve sites in Indian Hills. We are looking forward to the installation of three additional locations in Rolling Fields in the coming months. These cameras capture vehicle and license plate images and store them in a database for thirty days. The Indian Hills Police Department can then review that data during criminal investigations and set alerts to be notified if a stolen vehicle, or known suspect's vehicle, enters the area.

Over 70% of crimes are committed with a vehicle. The cameras, placed strategically at entrances, capture license plate images of vehicles entering Rolling Fields. Those license plate numbers are instantly matched to the National Crime Information System (NCIC) alerting IHPD of a suspect or stolen vehicle. The cameras in Indian Hills have already proven effective in solving several crimes in both Indian Hills and Rolling Fields. We believe this technology along with the public's awareness of the cameras, will prevent future crimes from occurring within our communities.

#### **OVERNIGHT PARKING**

Due to resident complaints of overnight parking along the street, the Indian Hills Police Department will be enforcing the City's parking ordinance (99-05 Section 5), which states "No person shall park any vehicle on any street for a period of time longer than 10 minutes between the hours of 2:00 AM and 5:00 AM of any day." The Commission is aware that some may periodically have overnight guests and asked IHPD to focus enforcement where vehicles are consistently in the street on main thoroughfares. Please be mindful of this restriction and feel free to contact us if you will be having driveway repairs that will not allow the use of your driveway.

# Rolling Fields Cares by Maggie Faurest




To update contact information in the Rolling Fields Directory, please complete the following steps:
